



Tree to Sea Drive

The road to Tahsis features waterfalls, animal viewing areas, picnic sites and scenic vistas. The road is 64 km of well maintained gravel road suitable for any vehicle in good condition. Four wheel drive is only needed after heavy winter snowfalls. Please drive at the posted speed, and watch for wildlife on the road.

1 Cala Falls

These falls are fed from Big Baldy Mt.

2 Upana Caves

A 150 metre trail takes you to a one hour self guided tour of the caves and underground river.

3 Bull Lake Summit

At 586 metres, the highest point on the road

4 Painted Rock

5 Conuma Peak Viewpoint

Conuma Peak is 1,481 metres high, and a marked trail takes you to the tree line on the mountainside.

6 Conuma River Hatchery

Salmon Hatchery tours Mon - Fri 8 am to 4 pm.

(M) Moutcha Bay

Moutcha Bay Marina, Campsite & Boat Launch. Restrooms, snack bar, scenic viewing area.

7 Head Bay Wildlife Viewing

Spectacular views and frequent wildlife sightings

8 Three Sisters Waterfall

The Three Sisters Falls originate on Malaspina Peak and fall from 1,520 metres.

9 Malaspina Lake

Habitat for trumpeter swans, bald eagles, blacktail deer, black bears, raccoons and cougars.

10 President's Tree

Also called 'The Big Tree', this Douglas Fir was set aside in honour of Jack Christensen, Pres. of Tahsis Co. in 1970.
